Dear Parents -

I am excited to share information about our all-school (grades 7 - 12) trip to Taos San Geronimo Feast on Friday September 30, 2022. Our Pueblo Convocation approach guides this important experience, and will reinforce our Core Value of Respect and make the connection that our traditions are the foundation of our education. Both of these concepts are the focus of September's Health & Wellness classes and are reinforced in our academic and student living programs.

Please read this letter carefully because this trip requires some important changes to our regular schedule. At the end, there is specific information for parents of dorm students and parents of day students. I am requesting all parents complete this form by September 20 so we can finalize meals and ensure each student has a seat on the bus to Taos. September 30 is a regular school day, and school policy will be followed regarding student absences. Please note that due to the complexity of taking the whole school to Taos, there are no individual scheduling accommodations for students to be on campus; for example, if a student has a doctor's appointment on September 30, they must be out the entire day, and will be excused per school policy.

Students and staff will arrive at Taos Pueblo at 10:30am and will depart at 4:00 pm so students can experience Taos Feast's trade fair and pole climb. This means that some day buses will be on a later pick up and drop off schedule. It also means dorm students have an expected arrival time back on campus between 5:45 pm - 6:00 pm. The exact transportation schedule for September 30 will be posted no later than September 20 on our SFIS website News & Announcements.

Students should dress in layers with current weather in mind; taking a warm sweater is advised. We encourage students to bring their own water. SFIS will provide snacks and lunch, but students may wish to bring spending money as there will be food vendors onsite. **Because this is a sacred day, cell phones are not allowed and will be confiscated**. If phones are confiscated, they may not be returned. In particular, no photographs or recordings of any type are allowed. Students are asked to be mindful that not all village homes are shops, but many are private homes and not to enter unless invited. Friday September 30 Special Information for Parents of Dorm Students

Schedule for September 30:

7:15 am HS/7:30 am MS: Dorm students follow the regular schedule for leaving the dorm and eating breakfast on campus.

8:30 am SFIS Buses leave campus for 10:30 am arrival time in Taos.

5:45-6:00 pm SFIS Buses return dorm students to campus.

Notes:

Weekend bags cannot be taken on the bus to/from Taos. Students must pick up their weekend bags from the dorms prior to going home on Friday evening. The last Railrunner train south leaves the South Capitol station at 6:51 pm on Friday. Dorm students may stay overnight at the dorm on September 30. We ask that 5 Day students who stay overnight September 30, leave Saturday morning, October 1. Students may return as normal on Sunday, October 2.

Students are not allowed on campus from 8:30 am - 5:45 pm on Friday September This is because academic and student living staff are accompanying students to Taos.

Registration Reminder

A reminder for parents. Registration is required for all new and returning students for the 2022-2023 school year. The registration will update your student's information in the NASIS system however, the information will not be changed until the registration is Approved/Posted as complete by the Office of Admissions. A completed registration has all information tabs complete and all required documents uploaded (physical, immunization record, COVID vaccination card, and insurance (private, Medicaid or let us know if you use IHS exclusively and do not have a card).

Office of Emergency Management

Effective immediately, and until further notice. (Includes Staff, Students, and Visitors)

SFIS is moving to "Indoor Masking Recommended", as per the SFIS Masking Policy. This is because currently, all counties in New Mexico have community COVID levels at low or medium.

I want to be clear that this could change based on increases in community COVID levels in any of

the NM Counties that are represented at SFIS. (Sandoval, Santa Fe, Bernalillo, Taos, McKinney, San Juan, San Miguel, Rio Arriba, Lincoln, Cibola and Valencia Counties). If one of the mentioned counties reverts to high levels, we must revert to "Indoor Masking Required".

The CDC updates this county data every Thursday evening, therefore I will update the SFIS community on Fridays, IF any changes occur that require us to adjust the masking requirements.

Masking is a personal choice, we encourage you to make this decision in consideration of those around you, both at home and at school, and remember that masking is still recommended. Be sure to respect others decisions regarding masking – there is no right or wrong answer here.

If you are symptomatic in any way, be aware that the Guidance Tree clearly states the requirement for continued masking

additionally if you were positive for COVID in the last 10 days and have completed your isolation period you are still required to mask indoors until you are outside the 10 day window

Food Delivery Information

Dear SFIS Parents/Guardians,

Our policy regarding food deliveries for SY 22-23 has changed. Below is the new guidance regarding this policy:

- 1. Parents/Guardians may deliver food to their students between the hours of 6:30pm-8:30pm.
- 2. No 3rd party delivery services (UberEats, DoorDash, Dominoes Delivery, etc.) any drivers that arrive at SFIS from any 3rd party with a food delivery will be turned around at the gate.
- 3. No food deliveries during the academic day (There is one exception to this rule as noted in #4).
- 4. Birthday Exception: Parents may deliver cake, treats, or food on students' birthday during the students' lunch period, or after 4:00pm. Parents MUST coordinate this with the ACADEMIC OFFICE for lunch period deliveries, or with the STUDENT LIVING OFFICE for afterschool deliveries before 6:30pm.






Paired up with a college mentor, get exposed to various medical professionals and traditional healers.


Each of our students creates and implements a youth-led health project to improve their community.
